



EAGLE ROOST VIEW

Eagle Roost View in Marshall County is 17 acres of steep, mixed pine-hardwood covered property along AL-227 and serves as an addition to Guntersville State Park. The tract provides 2,000 feet of frontage for watching eagles across Town Creek Canyon.

Directions:

From Huntsville, take US 431 South approximately 37 miles to AL-227 in Guntersville. Turn left on AL-227 and travel approximately 13 miles and you will come to a intersection where AL-227 will turn right and S. Sauty Road will go straight. Stay on AL-227 and travel approximately 2.7 miles and the property will be on the right.

Parking is along the side of the road.
